



Behaviour Policy for students of Ippon Judo LONDON

Ippon Judo London operates a colour-coded behaviour policy. It is a three-step system and illustrates the standard of behaviour expected from our students.

Three-step Behaviour Policy

<u>Yellow</u>	<p><u>Minor behavioural issues in class.</u></p> <p>Lack of engagement, immature behaviour, talking over the coach are all examples of student actions that will be addressed by the coach during or after the session.</p>
<u>Amber</u>	<p><u>Ongoing behavioural issues in class or a serious incident.</u></p> <p>This will be addressed by the coach in class and followed up with an email or conversation with the student's parents/guardians.</p> <p>This is a warning and such behaviour and lack of correction could result in dismissal from the Judo Club.</p>
<u>Red</u>	<p><u>Behaviour, already highlighted as unacceptable, is continuing or a serious incident has occurred.</u></p> <p>The parents/guardians of the student will be asked to find alternative judo provision for their child. A refund for the outstanding weeks of the judo block will be given.</p> <p>If considered necessary, a report to our Club Welfare Officer and The British Judo Association Safeguarding team will be made.</p> <p>Physical, verbal or written abuse to other judoka or our coaches by any student or parent/guardian will not be tolerated.</p>

Awards for Positive behaviour

- Star Judoka (once a week in younger classes)
- Gradings - judoka are assessed on every aspect of the Judo Code
- Invitation to the Purple Panthers or Lime Lemurs Talent Development Squad sessions
